<p>Topic sentence</p> <p>Points:</p>	<p>-This topic sentence also has an element of a hook in it, it attracts the reader.</p> <p>-This topic sentence shares an idea that the reader may not have entertained.</p>	<p>-Topic sentence has subject, attitude, limit.</p> <p>-The size of the subject is "just right" for a paragraph.</p> <p>-The attitude (voice) is debatable: opinion, feeling, impression, perception.</p> <p>-It is not a fact.</p> <p>-The limit gives direction; it narrows the subject.</p>	<p>-The topic sentence does not have all its parts.</p> <p>-The attitude in the topic sentence is closer to fact than opinion.</p>	<p>-No topic sentence exists.</p>
<p>Generalizations</p> <p>Points:</p>	<p>-The generalization uses variety in sentence structure.</p> <p>-The attitude reinforces the the topic sentences of the paragraphs</p>	<p>-The generalization is a complete sentence with a subject and attitude.</p> <p>-The subject is a subtopic of the subject of the topic sentence.</p> <p>-Generalizations are ordered and clear.</p>	<p>-The generalization is not a complete sentence.</p> <p>-the subject of the generalization is the same as the one in the topic sentence.</p> <p>-No specific order exists.</p>	<p>-No generalizations exist.</p>
<p>Details</p> <p>Points:</p>	<p>-Details are not common or cliché.</p> <p>-They "fit together" to create a complete picture.</p> <p>-Details evoke emotion in the reader.</p>	<p>-Details are facts, examples, images.</p> <p>-Details contains no attitude.</p> <p>-Details are organized (ex. from least to most important)</p>	<p>-Details have attitude.</p> <p>-Details are not related to each other; they do not "fit together."</p> <p>-No order is evident.</p>	<p>-Details are too few in number to affect the reader.</p> <p>-Details are absent.</p>
<p>Transitions</p> <p>Points:</p>	<p>-There is a variety of transitions used.</p>	<p>-Key words or synonyms for the key words are attached to generalizations to form transitions.</p> <p>-Details are linked together with each other and with the generalization.</p>		<p>-No transitions exist.</p>
<p>Closing Sentence</p> <p>Points:</p>	<p>-The closing sentence hints at the next paragraph.</p>	<p>-The closing sentence is stronger than the topic sentence.</p> <p>-It does not use the same words as the topic sentence.</p> <p>-It makes the paragraph feel like it is finished, that it "sits down."</p>	<p>-The closing repeats the topic sentence.</p>	<p>-No closing exists.</p>
